Prepare to Teach

Welcome to a new school year in Carmel Preschool Ministry. If we were able to come to church this week as usual, your preschooler would be moving up a "grade"! We will be starting a new series today on Creation. How foundational for our children to learn from such a young age what a great big God we serve. He speaks and the world was created! God's plan was good. Read Genesis 1:1 through 2:3 today to prepare for teaching your children of how God created the world and everything in it.

Make It Stick

This month we will follow along with the Creation Kit that you picked up from the church. If you didn't get a chance to come Thursday, please stop by any time during the work week and we will get one to you! Each week, the children will complete an art page for each Day of Creation. The pages will make up a book for them to keep. We have also included a fun tangible item to help them remember what they learned during that week's lesson. This week we are learning about Days 1 and 2. On the first day, God created light and darkness. He called the light Day and the darkness Night. On day two God created the expanse we call sky and separated it from the water. Make sure to read the account from Genesis for yourself.

Read the Beginner's Bible account of Genesis 1 on pages 7-13.

Talk

Use these questions to help you review the story with your child:

- Who created the world?
- What was the first thing that God created?
- What did He call the light?
- What did God call the darkness?
- What did God create on the second day?
